Field Placement Leads Grad to Employment at "Dream Firm"

Ruixin (Rayna) Li came to Fleming College from China with a background in law, ready for a new career and life change.

"I was so shy and quiet before. I lacked leadership skills and did not want any attention," said Rayna, who got involved with the SAC Street Team, served as an International Student Ambassador, volunteered on- and off-campus and more while at Fleming College. "I changed my career and my personality here. Coming to Canada is the best choice I have ever made."

Rayna came to Fleming College for the Business Administration – Accounting program, which she describes as awesome, amazing, wonderful and meaningful. She credits her program faculty for their support, advice and kindness, explaining "They are all warm-hearted and care for us. The Accounting program is much more like a family."

Rayna says she truly values the advice of her faculty, including program coordinator Shelly York, who advised Rayna to earn her CPA designation through CPA Ontario. "I am really lucky to have followed her advice. It will have life-long benefits for me!" said Rayna.

What drew Rayna to the Business Administration – Accounting program was the work placement, where students apply their knowledge and skills to a real work setting. Rayna completed her four-month work placement at Baker Tilly, providing review and audit technician support for large businesses and non-profit organizations; accounting and bookkeeping for small to medium clients; supporting the preparation of financial statements and tax returns; and liaising with third parties, partners, managers, clients and staff.

"All of the content you learn, like QuickBooks, Profile and Audit, all come together," said Rayna of her placement experience. "All the things I learned from College are useful and handy, and I got practice through real-life experience."

Rayna said her colleagues, managers and partners at Baker Tilly were all very approachable and kind, and always checked in to ensure everything was going well for her.

"It is a wonderful learning environment," said Rayna. "We have so many fun activities and people here are professional with a sense of humour, not just suits."

Rayna believes work placements are an amazing opportunity for all students, and advises those entering a

placement opportunity to always be on time, responsible and have a good attitude.

"It is a job, not only a learning placement," she said. "Do not be afraid of asking questions and making mistakes – that's how we learn. Please keep telling yourself 'you can do it,' and tell your boss 'I am willing to learn and I can do it.'"

Rayna graduated from Fleming College this June and is thrilled that her placement led to full-time employment.

"I love the job I am doing now. I love it," said Rayna, who is working as a Staff Accountant at Baker Tilly. "The partners, Richard Steiginga and Joanna Park, and COO Kim Freeburn surprised me; they had planned on hiring me but nobody told me anything about it. Then, I got my offer and I literally cried with happiness in their office. It is so good when you get hired by your dream firm!"

Rayna said she loves working at Baker Tilly because it is fast-paced and challenging. "There are different clients and different files and different problems to tackle, which makes me excited and lights me up immediately," she explains. "Accounting is not only about numbers, it is more like you have to understand how their business and industry works and then you work with your client's numbers, the policies and rules. It's an interesting and challenging job."

New Academic Programs for 2020

Fleming College will offer a variety of new diploma, certificate and graduate programs beginning in 2020. Each program meets a demand within the rapidly changing labour market and will provide students with the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in their chosen career.

- Food and Nutrition Management, a Graduate Certificate program that will focus on culinary management and nutrition skills that give students an edge on advanced supervisory or management positions.
- Mechatronics, a Graduate Certificate program focused on advanced manufacturing, industrial automation, robotics, electronics engineering and computer programming.
- Supply Chain Management Global Logistics, a Graduate Certificate program where students will learn a diverse set of skills to successfully oversee, synchronize and manage supply chain operations.
- Conservation Biology, a Diploma program in which students focus on the conservation of atrisk animal populations using current research and technologies, including genetics and environmental DNA (eDNA).
- This Graduate Certificate program teaches professionals how to plan for, respond, and work to manage natural, technological and human-caused disasters. The primarily online program provides the knowledge, skills and practical hands-on training to promote resilience and ensure communities continue to function, recover and thrive.
- Community Pharmacy Assistant, a Graduate
 Certificate program where students work

 pharmacy settings.
- Geothermal Systems, a Graduate Certificate program that prepares students to install, maintain and repair geothermal loop fields and hydronic systems for heating and cooling buildings.

(Parks and Recreation '84)



A Thermo Scientific™ ADR 1500 Real Time Ambient Dust Monitor, a Thermo Scientific™ MIRAN SapphIRe Portable Ambient Analyzer and two Thermo Scientific™ pDR-1500 Personal DataRam™ devices were integrated into the investigation and environmental monitoring courses taught in the Earth Resources Technician Coop and Environmental Technician/Technologist programs. Students will use the instruments to learn how to measure mass concentrations of dust, smoke, mists and fumes in real-time.

"These instruments will greatly enhance the educational experience for hundreds of students within Fleming's new GeoCentre and will assist students in developing real-world skills in preparation for their environmental careers," says **Joanna Hodge**, Professor of Geology. 2019 Alumnus of Distinction Award

Tim McClure's personal and career success is due to an exceptional drive to win. A drive that sparked as early as his college days.

Fresh out of Fleming, McClure was thrust into a leadership role in the hockey business, heading up the sales, marketing and pro services for US-based Christian Hockey Sticks.

Only a few short years later, he was recruited to join the world's largest supplier of licensed sports apparel, Starter Corporation. His sharp focus on building brands and increasing sales growth in the professional sports marketing business were important factors in turning the Starter brand into an industry leader in the 90s.

In his role as Senior Vice President, he worked directly with major sports leagues including the NHL, MLB, NBA, NFL and Hockey Canada. Major corporations such as Labatt, McDonalds, Coca Cola and General Motors came to trust McClure; his ability to deliver tailored programs resulted in building very successful strategic partnerships.

McClure's long trail of success followed him to fashion eyewear industry giant Luxottica Group, where he championed the Canadian sales team to develop renowned brands such as Ray Ban, Prada, Burberry and Versace. He earned a position as Luxottica's Senior Director of North America in New York and, with his team of 400 sales and marketing professionals, McClure achieved record-setting sales and profitability results.

McClure's amazing professional career suddenly collided with a terrifying personal crisis. On February 4, 2011, McClure was diagnosed with inoperable Stage 4 cancer after a large tumour was discovered in his throat. He was told that if he was to survive the aggressive treatment, chances were that he would require a feeding tube for the rest of his life and never speak again.

Like many cancer patients, this experience changed McClure's outlook on life in a fast-moving corporate world. It ignited an entrepreneurial spirit. That spark led to the establishment of Tim McClure and Partners in 2012, a business specializing in motivational speaking, leadership, business, corporate culture and brand consulting.

"Sometimes our brightest moments of inspiration come from our darkest moments of adversity," says McClure.

With a new perspective on life, McClure realized that giving back was important to his own personal fulfilment. This insight, combined with his business savvy, inspired the Great Next Chapter Foundation to help individuals cope and manage the emotional and mental challenges that come with battling life-threatening illnesses. Through his Foundation, McClure shifts attitudes to help individuals uncover an inner source of personal healing while facing medical treatments.

Today he speaks to corporations, associations, professional sports teams and high school, college and university students about overcoming obstacles, beating the odds and living life to the fullest.

"I will challenge others to take control of their story – to do the things that they think they cannot do by realizing the power within themselves, while leaving room in their hearts and minds to achieve the unimaginable," says McClure.

McClure's professional career awards include the prestigious Scotiabank Game Changers Award, the BMW Hero Award, and the 2019 Fleming College Alumnus of Distinction Award for remarkable career success and impact on community.

PedalBoro Party Bike First Voyage

It has been a really wild ride transforming our little bike dream into a fully realized business and we couldn't have done it without the amazing support of our Peterborough community. With a remarkable Fleming College student experience, some hard work, and a lot of community support, **Hillary Flood** (Business Administration - Marketing '12) unveiled Peterborough's first PedalBoro bike tour business in July, along with her co-founder Pete Rellinger. Cruising at a leisurely 12km/hour, the 15-passenger party bike takes riders on a heartpumping adventure tour of downtown Peterborough's vibrant food and beverage scene. The Pub Crawl tour includes a few stops at three local pubs that feature local, regional and Ontario craft beers. PedalBoro's Dish Crawl provides a food tour experience.

The idea for a group pedal bike in Peterborough was sparked by Flood's experience as a Fleming student. During the Fleming International Learning Experience (FILE) trip to Europe, Flood came across the unique tourism experience in Berlin, Germany. It was something Flood packed in the back of her mind as a possible business venture. As she worked as a coordinator in the Transportation and Urban Design department at GreenUp and at Peterborough Pulse, Flood's bike dream to showcase her town kept coming back.

With the launch of PedalBoro, Peterborough has become the fifth Canadian city to host this new form of cycle tourism; other cities include Edmonton, Montreal, London and Vancouver. Over the past five years, party bike tourism has exploded in the North American market – with 60 party bike tours in operation in the United States.
