

Boston Bombings: A Marathon Runner's Experience

"The doctors, nurses, emergency

response teams and hundreds

of volunteers are heroes to us all!"

he road to the Boston Marathon is very long and often turbulent, but one filled with such a sense of accomplishment and reward when the finish line is in sight. The finish line is the only thing a qualified runner can think about for months. They cherish the moment they can say "I finished Boston." I know this feeling because I have been fortunate to participate in the event in 2006, 2008 and Monday, April 15th, 2013 when tragedy struck.

The setting in Athlete's Village on Monday morning prior to the race was exactly how it should have been. Runners from all over the world were mingling with one another, talking about past marathons, qualifying times and praise for the beautiful sunny day. It was hard not to befriend someone that morning because everyone had a smile on their face and there was a definite sense of pride. Of course everyone had pre-race butterflies but that is to be expected.

When I lined up to start the race my emotions ran high. The national anthem was being played and the skies were bright. It

was going to be a good day ahead. I was so excited to get started down

the familiar route that is not only iconic but overflowing with the most amazing spectators. The route of the Boston Marathon is acknowledged for the beautiful towns, magnificent people and also for the technical difficulty that starts at Mile One. Thankfully I knew what to expect and held back to save enough energy for the last seven miles which have proven to be the hardest.

While approaching the 22 mile marker, I looked up to see the familiar CITGO sign that flashes brightly and brings the runners home to Boylston Street. When the CITGO sign is in sight,

the finish line is not far off. The crowd also intensifies and it's so loud you can hardly hear yourself think. MP3 player turned off long ago, I soaked up the wonderful sounds of the city as they helped me through the final miles. When I rounded the corner to Boylston Street it became clear – my final marathon would soon be over and I was so very happy!


The view at the finish line is full of exhausted but exhilarated runners all searching for their loved ones for that victory hug. I had seen my family along the course and we had agreed to meet back at the hotel room instead of trying to find everyone together. I was blessed to have ten family members cheering me on. The winds picked up and I started to get a chill so I made my way through the crowd and hopped in the first taxi cab I could find. I was greeted at the hotel by my family – and by hugs.

Unfortunately, the celebration did not last long; the media announced the horrific bombings at the finish line. A finish line that had just provided me with so much joy was now a place of

> carnage and destruction. Immediately the city was on lock down and chaos filled the lives of so many people. I cannot try to

imagine what the families and friends of the victims have been dealing with and will have to accept for the rest of their lives. What I can do, and everyone can do, is pray for them and keep them forever in your thoughts. We should pray for strength, comfort and resolution.

While the city of Boston tries to recover, my heart goes out to the families of the three young people that were killed and the hundreds of people left injured. The doctors, nurses, emergency response teams and hundreds of volunteers are heroes to us all!

I also sympathize for the thousands of runners that did not get to cross the finish line. While it is not a concern in a moment of tragedy it should be recognized that they worked very hard to be there and their dream was shattered. I do hope those participants that did not finish will return to that beautiful place and run up Boylston Street to receive their reward.

The city needs our support – whether it be in thought, prayer or acts of kindness. I know for certain I will be back – as a very thankful and grateful spectator. *

They are anxious to merge their unique personalities with teaching in the new KTTC training facility where enclosed shops and a two-story 27,000 square foot modular open learning space will allow for flexibility and advanced delivery of their programs. The Trades Programs have been operating at the McRae Campus on Bonnacord Street

in Peterborough since 1967. The KTTC will bring the trades students together with Sutherland Campus students to enhance their learning environment and provide easy access to student services, food services and student life activities that will create a more well-rounded college experience – Blane, Gord, George, James, Jim, John, Scott and Val are the pillars in their overall experience! *

Local and provincial forecasts are predicting a shortage of an estimated 190,000 skilled workers by 2020. Fleming's Trades and Technology faculty will train students for those jobs to help address the needs in our community and the provincial shortfall.

The LEED Gold certification requires the efficient use of energy, water and materials to reduce a building's operating costs, minimize environmental impact and improve indoor environmental quality. Following LEED Gold guidelines ensures that Fleming integrates green features and best building practices to support its mission to provide a sustainable and healthy future.
